\*These assignments are guidelines to help ensure we don't overwhelm the nursing staff; please discuss appropriate assignments with charge RN.

\*Because we strive to ensure the highest quality care, we've augmented our regular staff with agency and travel nurses. You will most likely need to make assignments that include the travel staff. Please make sure you are available to your students at all times for prodedures and bedside medication verification.

\*Any cell identified with an \* are experiences available to use when decreased census dictates, or in the case of Cath Lab, procedures are available. These departments are only here from 0830 - 1700.

\*Any cell with a color corresponding to your rotation that does not have a number is available to you as census, or student requests are made. If you have additional needs we will work to give your students the experiences they require.

\*Please leave your name, number and time student is done for the day with OR charge. No outside clothing will be worn in the OR, students must obtain hospital scrubs from the OR desk. Hats, shoe covers and a level III mask with eye protection must be worn when observing at the field

\*When assignments are made in SBH you should enter through the back door off the IRU dining room. Backpacks, purses or other personal items should remain in the breakroom. Check in with the charge RN on arrival. Please plan on interacting with patients or joining in with group activities. Due to the nature of the patient population, some may demonstrate verbal and physical aggression. \*Students in the ED will be assigned to an RN by the Charge RN. Students should be introduced to Charge RN on arrival. Students should be prepared to verbalize skills they are able to do (start IV, give meds place foleys) or their objectives (observation). They must be engaged and want to learn. There is limited space at the nurses station, and not enough room for everyone to have a computer. The quickest way to disengage an ED nurse is to refuse an experience, even if "I've already done that". Every experience is a learning opportunity.
